PROCEDURE FOR PHONE SESSIONS

REGULAR PHONE SESSION

Dr. Federici will initiate all phone sessions. If you are unavailable at the scheduled time for a phone session, or do not answer the call, Dr. Federici will wait a few minutes and call you back. He will try to reach you three times. If circumstances prevented you from answering the phone when Dr. Federici called, if it is safe, you may call him if it is still within the time frame of your scheduled appointment. Your phone session however will end at the originally scheduled ending time. If the call gets disconnected, Dr. Federici will return the call to you. If you are not in the midst of an emergency, and there were technical difficulties with the phone lines, and Dr. Federici did not return the call wait 2 minutes, and then call Dr. Federici at (973) 533-1208. In the unlikely event that Dr. Federici doesn't answer, please leave a message. Dr. Federici will return your call as soon as possible.

PATIENTS IN CRITICAL CRISIS PHONE SESSION

If Dr. Federici feels that you potentially could fall into a critical crisis category, he will discuss what you should to do in advance of phone sessions. In general, you should be going to the office for regular in-person sessions. If the circumstances are that you need Phone Sessions the *Emergency Plan* that should be followed. Make copies of the plan and have it posted in any location that you stay regularly.

EMERGENCY PLAN FOR PHONE SESSIONS

Tell Dr. Federici where you are, and who is near you. If the connection fails while your are speaking with Dr. Federici and you are experiencing an emergency situation you have several options, depending on the criteria and the severity of the crisis. Dr. Federici will try to call you back, but do not wait for him. You must take action. Call a trusted friend or family member if they are nearby. You can try calling your family physician, psychiatrist, or the nearest emergency room and ask for the psychologist or psychiatrist on call. If you are experiencing a life threatening emergency call 9-1-1.
